 - Paul uses the example of Pharaoh, a parallel to 1st century Israel, to reveal how God has used the Jews' unfaithfulness to accomplish His ______.
 - In order to fulfill His promise and deliver His Word, God will show mercy to the unfaithful when necessary, and He will harden the unfaithful when necessary. The fulfillment of God's promise does not depend on Israel's faithfulness.

 - It should be remembered that God never judicially hardens anyone who has not already ______ hardened by his or her own free choice.
