- C. Three common responses from proponents.
 - Some claim Leviticus 18:22 & 1 Corinthians 6 are not denouncing homosexuality, rather, it is denouncing pedophilia.
 - Arsenokoitai is a compound word: arseno is the word for "a male," and koitai is the word for "mat" or "bed."
 - As in English, the Greek word for "bed" can have both sexual and non-sexual meanings. In the context of **1** Corinthians
 6:9, koitai connotes an illicit sexual connotation.
 - 2. Jesus never addressed homosexuality. Mark 7:20-23
 - Jesus specifically condemns many sins. The one I want to point out is the Greek word, *porneia* (sexual immorality).



- This Greek word would have been understood by His Jewish listeners to mean the prohibited sexual behaviors that are mentioned in the book of Leviticus. One of which was homosexual sex.
- 1. Homosexuals are born that way. Romans 1:24-28
 - Romans teaches that homosexuality is a result of denying and disobeying God, not birth.
 - A person may be born with a greater susceptibility to homosexuality, just as some people are born with a tendency to violence and other sins.
 - Eight major identical twin studies show homosexuality is not genetic.

"A lot of our views on sexuality are not based on the Bible, rather, they are based on watching too much TV."

 - #1 Run...Flee...get out. Do not stay in the midst of temptation.
 - #2 Consciously avoid places or activities you know that will ______ temptations.
 - #3 Don't underestimate the power of Satan to tempt you, or the potential for serious harm if you continue to yield to these temptations.
 - #4 Remember, God can and will forgive sexual sins just as He forgives other sins. Surrender yourself to the Lord, asking Him to show you the way out of sin, and into the light of His freedom in His love. 1 Corinthians 10:13
 - #5 _____, Bible study, loving support of other believers, and asking to be filled by the Spirit of God you can gain strength to resist powerful temptations.
 - #6 If you already are deeply involved in homosexual behavior, seek help from a trustworthy pastor, mature believer, or a Christian counselor.
 - #7 _____ your sins to another believer.

James 5:16 "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results."
