Further Study on the Sermon from July 17, 2022

 The Apostle John has a lot to say about love in action. Read the following verses taken from two of the books he wrote and note what insights about love you find. Read 1 John 3:14-18.

John 13:34-35 A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all mean will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. [NIV]

1 John 4:20-21 If anyone says, "I love God," yet hates his brother, he is a liar. For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen. And he has given us this command: Whoever loves God must also love his brother. [NIV]

2. Pastor Lucas gave us five probing questions about love in the sermon this weekend. Take a minute to think about how you would evaluate yourself on each question using the scale below.
